Applicants must meet requirements determined by the national programme "<u>Programm zur Forschung und Entwicklung im BMLRT 2020-2025</u>", and each proposal submitted must be in line with the general policies of the BMLRT.

TOPIC-1: Die Erhaltung des genetischen Potentials von Nutztierrassen und Kulturpflanzensorten hat im GAP-Strategieplan hohe Priorität, weil die genetische Vielfalt wichtige Voraussetzung für züchterische Fortschritte und die Anpassungsfähigkeit an veränderte Umweltbedingungen (Klimaerwärmung) darstellt. Zentrale Themen für Forschungsarbeiten sind daher aus Sicht des BMLRT insbesondere Klimawandelanpassung (z.B. Kulturpflanzen mit erhöhter Toleranz gegenüber Trockenheit, Überschwemmungen, Widerstandsfähigkeit gegenüber neu eingewanderten Schädlingen / Krankheiten) und Klimaschutz (Kulturpflanzen die mit wenig Stickstoff viel Biomasse produzieren können, Rinderrassen die einen geringeren Methanausstoß haben). Interessant sind in diesem Zusammenhang auch die Untersuchung von Änderungen phänologischer Abläufe infolge der Klimaerwärmung.

TOPIC-3 ist für das BMLRT interessant, weil die Herausforderungen beim Thema Biodiversität / Naturschutz regional oft sehr unterschiedlich sind und es für Regionen immer wichtiger wird, gebietsspezifische Strategien und Konzepte für Arten und Lebensräume umzusetzen. Forschungsarbeiten sollen die Wiederherstellung der Konnektivität bzw. der Durchgängigkeit von v.a. intensiven Agrarlandschaften (Schaffung von Trittsteinbiotopen durch die Landschaftselementen). Wichtig sind auch Informationen darüber, wie Landschaftsstrukturen die Biodiversität von landwirtschaftlichen Betrieben beeinflussen.

- Applicants must keep their national contact point informed in the course of the preregistration of the proposal, so to avoid ineligibility of the proposal.
- Each email request sent to BMLRT must be indicated by the following subject line: ABD-call-2022-acronym-organisation, whereas acronym is the acronym of the proposal and organisation indicates the name of the applying organisation, respectively.
- Applying organisations shall also contact their respective legal department and research service department, if any, so to clarify internal coherence for all applicants from that particular organisation.
- Requested BMLRT contribution per project is limited to the budget provided in the table of the indicative call budget. The requested contribution includes the total costs requested.
- For one eligible project there will be only one contract between BMLRT and the respective Austrian partner, whereas additional Austrian partners shall be subcontracted. The Austrian partners should decide upon the lead partner amongst themselves at an early stage, and the lead partner must be eligible for funding.
- After the final selection for funding of a proposal the Austrian partner has to submit the project via www.dafne.at.

The funding from the Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Fisheries of Denmark for this call is under the auspices of the Board of the "Green Development and Demonstration Programme" (GUDP) and is administered by the Danish Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Fisheries.

GUDP is a funding programme with focus on motivating and promoting ambitious and green business oriented innovation activities in the Danish agriculture, fisheries and food sector. Thus, GUDP projects must induce green sustainability and economical sustainability simultaneously through the entire value chain. Green sustainability means having a focus on the environment, climate, nature, quality, sustainable exploitation of resources, food safety, human health, and animal welfare. Economical sustainability means having a focus on generating profit, socio-economic effects and addition of value to raw materials to support growth and competitiveness.

Projects shall meet the needs of the food industry and have to follow the rules and regulations of GUDP. Submission of an **additional questionnaire** prior to the preregistration deadline is mandatory for Danish applicants. The questionnaire **should be sent directly by the Danish project partner to the Danish contact person (see contact details above).**

Additional information:

For Danish applicants, the rules of GUDP prevail, but the international application- and budget templates should be used; only in case of funding, a budget scheme, participant datasheets and Gantt chart for the Danish part of the work has to be submitted.

Applications for funding can be submitted by:

Large, medium and small size enterprises (incl. stakeholders and similar associations, independent institutions, private research organizations, owners, tenants and users of farms) Research and other public knowledge institutes

Technical Service Institutes (GTS) – are classified as companies

Funding from GUDP cannot be granted directly to foreign institutions or businesses registered outside of Denmark; they can however be part of the Danish participation in a project on a consultancy basis.

Eligibility criteria:

To be eligible, partners requesting funding from ANR must meet all the following criteria:

- Similarity with another proposal

• The similarity between two Projects is established when these Projects (in their entirety or in part) describe identical main objectives or result from a simple adaptation. The French part of the project proposal must not be judged similar to a project (in whole or in part) that is already financed by the ANR or submitted to another ANR call for proposals.

- Requested funding

The funding requested from ANR for a project must be between $15\,000\,$ € and $200\,000\,$ €. If there are several partners requesting funding from ANR, the $200\,000\,$ € have to be shared. If a partner requesting funding from ANR is coordinator of a proposal, the maximum amount of funding requested can reach $250\,000\,$ €.

- Consortium composition

- Consortium composition ANR may finance Partners that have their primary establishment in France and/or Partners established in the EU and that can prove that they have a secondary establishment in France.
- To be eligible, the consortium must include at least one French public research organisation (EPA, EPSCP, EPST, EPIC).
- The involvement of an enterprise is encouraged but not mandatory. If a non-French enterprise is involved in a project, it is mandatory to involve a French enterprise; otherwise the French partners will be declared ineligible.

BMEL funding is based on §§ 23 and 44 BHO (Bundeshaushaltsordnung) and associated administrative regulations. The main items are the following:

- The funding regulations, follow up and reporting of publicly funded projects are regulated according to the "Nebenbestimmungen für Zuwendungen auf Ausgabenbasis des Bundesministeriums für Bildung und Forschung zur Projektförderung" (NABF, Stand: November 2019) and NKBF-2017 "Nebenbestimmungen für Zuwendungen auf Kostenbasis des Bundesministeriums für Bildung und Forschung an gewerbliche Unternehmen für Forschungs- und Entwicklungsvorhaben" (NKBF 2017, Stand: November 2019).
- Funding will be awarded as a non-repayable project grant.
- Eligible applicants are universities, universities of applied sciences, non-university research institutions, as well as Federal and State institutions with research tasks. Research institutions, which are jointly funded by the Federal Government and the 'Länder', may only be granted project funding under certain conditions and only for project-related expenditures in addition to their basic funding.
- Double funding is not possible.

- 2. The grant request by Irish RPOs must not exceed the maximum funding per project as set out above.

2. Teagasc Funding

Where grant-aid is sought from Teagasc this must be in the form of €96,000 for a four-year Walsh Scholarship-funded PhD. Please refer to the 'Funding Rules' of the Call Guidelines for Irish Applicants and to the Teagasc website (<u>Teagasc Walsh Scholarship Programme</u>) for more details on how the Walsh Scholarship funding is structured to meet the central call requirements.

It is not mandatory for Irish applicants to request grant-aid from both DAFM and Teagasc.
