Data on BE: In the category other forms, the data refer to human smuggling with aggravated circumstances (except for one case (+18) for who multiple forms of exploitation were registered

Data on BG: The presumed VOT was supported at the shelter for a temporary accommodation and support for victims of human trafficking of the National commission for combating of trafficking in human beings (NCCTHB) managed by the Demetra NGO in the region of Burgas, Bulgaria. The VOT received humanitarian, medical, psychological and social assistance, as well as initial legal counselling concerning her specific rights as a victim of the human trafficking crime was carried out with the woman. She was also consulted concerning the possibility of filing an application for international protection. Pre-trial proceeding was initiated by the law-enforcement authorities, having in mind her will to cooperate to the investigators and prosecution. At the same time, the Burgas prosecution office refused to initiate a criminal proceeding for human trafficking. The VOT wanted to return to her home-country and to her family and children. The safe voluntary return process was organized via IOM and in coordination with the shelre, a crisis centre in Sofia and the NCCTHB.

Data on CY: No such data available. Data concern persons who applied for asylum as UAMs (total for 2017: 221)

Data for CZ: Statistics available only regarding the presumed victims. These statistics express only the number of third country nationals included in the “Programme of Support and Protection of the Victims of Trafficking in Human Beings”. The number of children under 18 years of age are calculated separately and are not included in the Programme.

Data on DE: Figures for 2017 will be published in 2019

Data on EL:* the total number includes the nationalities below, Greek, Albanian, Afghani, Bulgarian, Moldovan, Ukrainian, Romanian, Russian.

Data on FR: No information is available for presumed victims of THB in France as information on this status depend on elements collected during the police investigation.

Figures related to victims of sexual exploitation are collected in the framework of police inquiries and do not record all victims of sexual exploitation but it concerns the number of victims identified in cases where the qualification of trafficking has been recognized.

This number does not reflect the total number of VoTs identified or receiving assistance in Norway in 2017. Norway does not have a formal identification authority. The number includes EEA citizens.

Data on SE: Numbers refer to persons presumed by the Swedish Migration Agency to be victims of trafficking in human beings. “Other forms” include trafficking for the purpose of begging,

Data on SI: Numbers refer to third-country nationals according to the Slovenian National Coordinator for THB and Ministry of the Interior. 16 citizens of the EU, among them one male over 18 years of age, have been identified as victims of THB in form of sexual explorations.

Data on SK: According to current national referral mechanism in Slovakia, a victim of trafficking in human beings can be formally identified only by criminal proceeding bodies.
