The Panel of Experts on Yemen, which is comprised of five experts, operates under the direction of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 2140 (2014).

Recommended candidates should possess a minimum of **ten years** of progressively responsible experience, with a minimum of three years of field experience, in the below mentioned relevant areas of expertise and competence:

- arms,
- armed groups,
- finance.
- international humanitarian law,
- regional issues.

The selection process will include an interview and other assessment methods to evaluate candidates' suitability. Sanctions experts are selected on the basis of demonstrated expertise in the relevant area of work, experience and educational background, with due regard to equitable geographic representation and gender balance. English and French are the working languages of the United Nations Secretariat. For the above-mentioned positions, fluency in English is required; knowledge of Arabic is an advantage.

Appointment duration is in accordance with the mandate of the Panel of Experts established by the Security Council. Experts are hired as consultants in line with the United Nations' administrative instruction concerning consultants and individual contractors (ST/AI/2013/4).
