

Information on the processing of personal data by Embassy of Poland in Baku

The present information ensures compliance with the obligation laid down in Article 13 (1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC, hereinafter referred to as the GDPR (OJ L 119, 4.5.2016, p. 1 and OJ L 127, 23.5.2018, p. 2).

1. Within the meaning of Article 4(7) of the GDPR, the controller of your personal data is the Minister of Foreign Affairs established in Poland, Warsaw, Al. J. Ch. Szucha 23, and the person carrying out the tasks of the controller is the head of Embassy of Poland established in Baku, Kichik Qala 2, AZ 1000 Azerbaijan.

2. The Data Protection Officer (DPO) was appointed at the MFA headquarters and in diplomatic missions abroad.

3. The data are processed on the basis of Article 6 (1a) of the GDPR, for the purpose of exchanging correspondence, maintain contacts, sending: notifications, invitations for organized events, newsletters and warnings by Embassy of Poland in Baku. You have the right for withdraw your consent in any moment through sending a demand in the electronic form on email: baku.amb.sekretariat@msz.gov.pl

4. Providing data is voluntary but necessary for the controller to take action. Failure to provide such data results in the inability to maintain contacts with the Embassy of Poland in Baku.

5. The personal data will be processed until the objection to further processing. Then data will be stored for archival purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 14 July 1983 on national archive resources and archives (Journal of Laws of 2020 item 164) and internal regulations of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

6. Only authorized employees of the Embassy of Poland in Baku referred to in paragraph 1 have access to the data.

7. The data will not be transferred to third countries or international organizations.

8. You have the right to control the processing of data as set out in Articles 15-19 of the GDPR, in particular the right of access, the right to rectification, the right to erasure and the right to restriction of processing, if applicable.

9. The personal data will not be processed by automated means that will impact on making decision, where it produces legal effects concerning data subjects or similarly significantly affects them. The personal data will not be subject to profiling.

10. The data subject has the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority at the following address:
