Agriculture in Europe

- Arable land represents 47% of the European area
- In 2015, nearly 4.4% of European workers were working in agriculture
- Almost three-quarters (72.8%) of the EU-28 agricultural labour force is concentrated in seven countries: Romania, Poland, Italy, France, Spain, Bulgaria and Germany.
- Agriculture is the fifth largest employer of men in the EU and the seventh largest employer of women.
- Agriculture is ranked as one of the three most hazardous sectors together with mining and construction.









Vision Zero Guides for Agriculture
