



The IdeaLab: call for ground-breaking research projects



What is the IdeaLab?


The IdeaLab is an **innovative way of generating research projects** coupled with real-time peer-review.

The crucial element of the method is an interactive and intensive **5-day workshop** involving approx. **30 participants** from **a range of disciplines** and backgrounds and a team of **experts** and **stakeholders** that is organised in order to drive **new approaches** to address research challenges on a specific topic.



The IdeaLab workshop in the NCBR

Topic:

Cities for the future: services and solutions

Participants:

Legal entities (public or private entities, commercial or non-commercial as well as non-governmental organisations, including research organisation and enterprises) from Poland, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein can propose candidates for the IdeaLab workshop.

- at least 10 participants from Polish research organisations and enterprises
- at least 10 participants from Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein

- potential project promoters
- potential project partners

IdeaLab workshop

Requirements for participants (TBC)

- higher education;
- be affiliated with a legal entity in Poland, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein;
- have command of the English language at a professional level;
- be ready to participate for a whole week, 2-6 March 2020, in an IdeaLab workshop in Poland.

Participants from various fields (e.g. urban planning & governance, ecology, ITC, social science and other specialists). The list of areas is open-ended. If your profession is not on the list, but you feel that your knowledge and experience can help to shape cities for the future you are invited to submit your application!

Personal character, soft skills (team work, creativity, communication skills, willingness to work with individuals, who they may not know, stepping outside their area of expertise).



IdeaLab workshop

How to apply?

- entity's statement (appointment for the participant and declaration of support to the idea developed during the workshop)
- participant's application form (knowledge and experience in the field, soft skills and personal characteristic, contact data)
- participant's CV in English
- participant's statement (willingness to be present during the entire workshop, processing of personal data)

Selection process of participants

- external experts: director and mentors
- individual assessment and panel assessment
- cross-disciplinary group of participants
- balance in regions (countries), gender, including young researchers
- conflict of interest

Call for full proposals

Eligibility of participants (legal entities)

The project ideas is developed by a research team formed during the workshop. Eligible partnerships consist of at least one entity from Poland and one entity from Iceland, Lichtenstein or Norway.

Project promotor:

Research organisation from Poland

or

Enterprise from Poland

Project partner(s):

 any public or private entity, commercial or non-commercial as well as non-governmental organisations, established as a legal person in Poland

or

Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein.





Call for full proposals

Basic information

Total budget for funding projects:


6,651,016 €

- Minimum grant amount: 500,000 €
- Maximum grant amount: 6,651,016 €
- Duration of the call: 2 months (March-May 2020)

Peer review:

- ✓ proposals are assessed by external experts
- ✓ the main criterion: consistency with the project idea developed during the IdeaLab workshop
- ✓ approval of the ranking list by the Programme Committee
