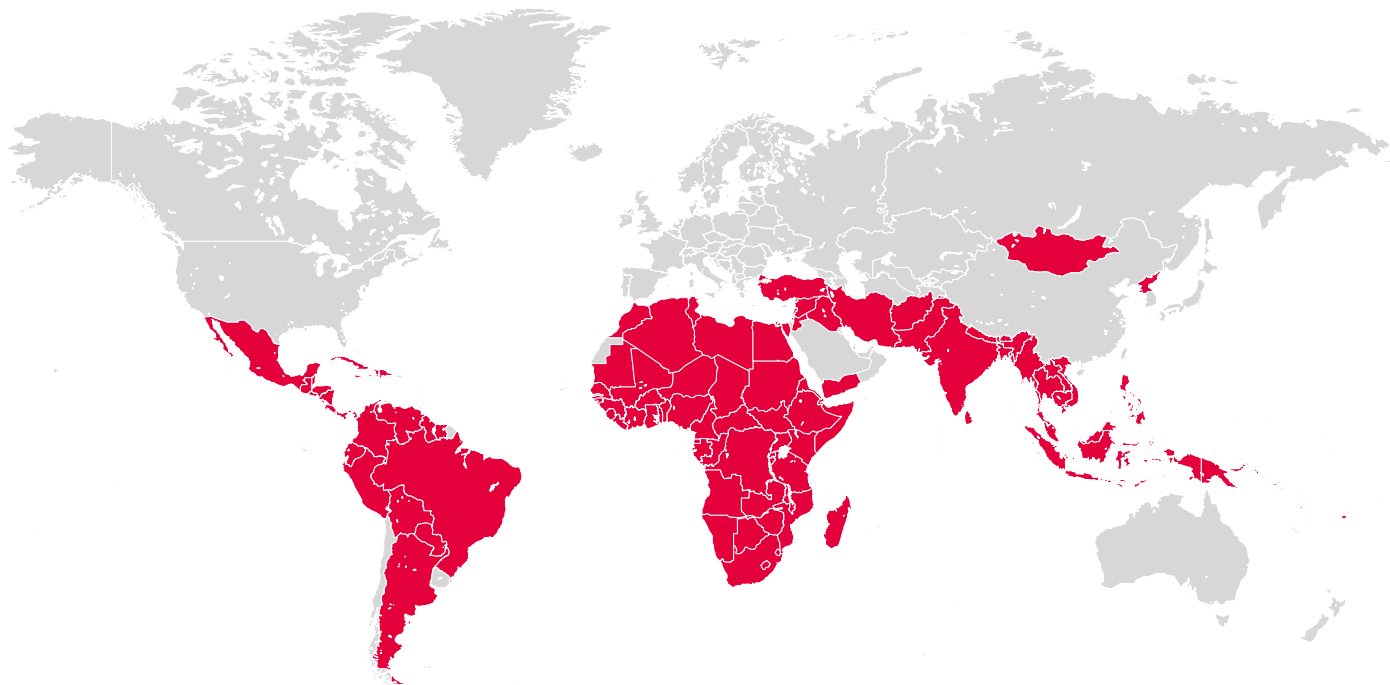

## Who can apply for the Programme?

- candidates planning to continue education at master's degree level in the
- field of engineering and technical, agricultural, applied and life sciences
- citizens of developing countries in Africa, North, South and West Asia and Latin America

## Why join the Lukaszewicz Programme?

- tuition-free second-cycle (master's degree) studies at one of several hundred university departments based in the biggest Polish cities
- Polish language course preparing candidates to take up studies in Poland (while enjoying scholarship)
- a monthly scholarship of PLN 1,700 (approx. EUR 400) during the preparatory course and PLN 1,500 (approx. EUR 350) during the master degree studies
- a European diploma certifying completion of studies, honoured and respected worldwide
