Phytosanitary requirement for importation of *Beta vulgaris* seed to Iran

- **1- Procurement of valid phytosanitary certificate** from the country of origin in whose Additional Declarations (A.D) refers to items mentioned below:
- A) Freeness of the consignment from the following pests and diseases has been confirmed:
 - 1. Pseudomonas syringae pv. aptata
 - 2. Curtobacterium flaccumfaciens pv. betae
 - 3. Beet 1,2,3 alphacryptovirus
 - 4. Arabis mosaic virus
- B) It should be emphasized that the mother plants were inspected during the growing season and were free from following disease

Or

the freeness of seeds from following diseases has been confirmed by laboratory tests and the stamped laboratory report (document) should be attached to phytosanitary certificate:

1- Tomato black ring virus

Note:

Mentioning the scientific name of above pest and diseases in the phytosanitary certificate of above goods is mandatory; otherwise, customs clearance will be prevented due to insufficient documentation, any and all damages and losses being on importers account.

- 2- Treatment of seeds with a suitable fungicide and insecticide in the country of origin and write their characteristics in phytosanitary certificate.
- 3- Consignment should be free from soil, plant residues, weed seeds, live insect or signs of disease.
