










PRINCIPLES OF THE HEI INITIATIVE








TIMELINE

- March 2021: Launch of Initiative & Pilot Call
- March-May 2021: Pilot Call
- ⇒ 23 projects could receive funding of up to €1.2 m each for maximum 24 months
- June-July 2021: Pilot Call project selection announcement and commencement
- 18 November 2021: 2nd Call
- July 2022: 2nd Call project commencement
- Based on pre-pilot phase, the initiative will be extended into the period 2024-2027

- Research institutes
- Public bodies at local, regional or national level
- Intermediary organisations or associations which represent Higher Education Institutions
- Horizon Europe countries





HEInnovate

HEInnovate is a free self-assessment tool for HEIs who wish to explore their innovative potential

- Integral part of the HEI Initiative
- Identifies HEIs' strengths and weaknesses in the areas of entrepreneurship and innovation
- Allows HEIs to compare and their evolution over time
- 100% confidential
- Available in all EU languages
- No comparison/ranking with other institutions








INNOVATION VISION ACTION PLAN (IVAP)

Applying HEIs are required to prepare a vision for 2030 with a clear, stepby-step action plan leading to lasting impact

- **Vision** end goals HEIs want to achieve by 2030
- Action plan concrete, clear and detailed (deliverables, milestones, stakeholders, budget, tracking of results, and risk management)
- Impact deep-rooted and tangible institutional changes

The IVAP is the heart of the application and the project itself.
