The Secretariat of the United Nations presents its compliments to the Permanent Missions of Member States to the United Nations and invites Member States to recommend qualified individuals to serve on the Panel of Experts established pursuant to resolution <u>2127 (2013)</u> on the Central African Republic, subject to the extension of the Panel mandate by the Security Council in July 2024.

Nominations are sought for expert positions on the Panel of Experts on the Central African Republic. Recommended candidates should possess a minimum of ten years of progressively responsible experience, with a minimum of three years of field experience, in the following areas of expertise and competence:

- Armed groups
- Arms;
- Natural resources/Finance;
- Humanitarian affairs;
- Regional affairs

The selection process will include an interview and other assessment methods to evaluate candidates' suitability. Sanctions experts are selected on the basis of demonstrated expertise in the relevant area of work, experience and educational background, with due regard to equitable geographic representation and gender balance. English and French are the working languages of the United Nations Secretariat. For these positions, fluency in English and French is required; knowledge of another UN official language is an advantage.

Appointment duration is in inaccordance with the mandate of the expert panel established by the Security Council. Experts are hired as consultants in line with the United Nations' administrative instruction concerning consultants and individual contractors (<u>ST/AI/2013/4</u>).
