

CONTENT RELATED CRITERIA – SGS 2

The maximum total score achievable for a project application is 100 points. Applications that fulfil all the eliminating criteria and obtain in total minimum 60 points (average score), including 30 points (average score) in criterion 3 - *Importance of the project and its potential contribution to the development of the system of preventing domestic violence against the elderly and people with disabilities*, shall be recommendable for funding. Positive assessment result is not equivalent to receiving funding. Projects will be funded within the limits of available allocation.

- the Applicant selected the required indicators under Outcome 2 for the *Justice Programme*;
- the Applicant selected the required indicator under Output 2.3 for the *Justice Programme*;
